

Instructions for Contributors

Submission

The journal Baessler-Archiv publishes contributions of relevance to museums questions, theoretically informed results on material culture, past and present, in any region and articles about the main subjects as collections, ethnographical research, conservation and exhibitions. Original articles are welcomed in German, English, French and Spanish. Manuscripts should be submitted in one copy together with a diskette and sent to the Editors, Ethnologisches Museum, Arnimallee 27, 14195 Berlin. Submitted articles should not be under consideration elsewhere.

Presentation

Manuscripts should not exceed 40 pages of text, printed single-sided, one and one-half spaced, with a 3 cm margin on all sides. Please arrange your manuscript in the following order of presentation: The title, author's name (with capitals) and reference of locality are followed by an English abstract of not more than 200 words. Foreign words should be italicized throughout the article. Footnotes should be kept to a minimum und numbered consecutively. All maps, diagrams, drawings and photos should be on a separate sheet (or sheets), referred to as figures, and should be numbered consecutively in Arabic numerals. Please indicate in the text where they should appear. Any captions to figures should be on a separate sheet.

References

References within the text should be given by the name of the author, the year of publication, and the number of the page, e.g.:

... as Douglas (1966: 2) has noted ...

Douglas has already said: "Dirt offends against order" (1966: 2).

... the well-known maxime: "Dirt offends against order" (Douglas 1966: 2) ...

At the end of the article all references cited should be arranged alphabetically according to the surnames of the authors and in chronological order in the following style:
