The glyph 74:565a:178.117 may address here God K/God GII, but could also entitle the lord who offers his blood. With respect to T 565a = tam/tan (Dütting 1979) I refer to Pocomchi (Zuñiga): tam = augmento, acrecentamiento; tamic = multiplicarse, augmentar. Quiché (Basseta): tamaric = crecer, multiplicar, augmentarse. Kekchi (Sedat): tamc = juntarse, abundar. Since tam means also "interior, depth" in many Maya languages (see op.cit.), one could interpret 74:565a also as mah.tam, "master/lord of the depth", and the glyph 74:565a:178.117 as "lord of the depth who releases the plants/elotes".

The bottom of the TFC-Tablet seems to represent the surface of a sea, as indicated by "spirals" T 579 which probably represent "waves", and by T 23, (y)al, "liquid, water" (left corner).




Fig. 13 Tablet Temple of the Cross, Palenque, central design (drawing by LINDA SCHELE).

The Cross-Tablet (Fig. 13)

The TC, finally, in the *north* of the Cross group is opened towards the south. For the entering viewer the tablet is located in the north. Its central imagery is dominated by spiral-eyes which — in contrast to the situation on the Sarcophagus lid where the
