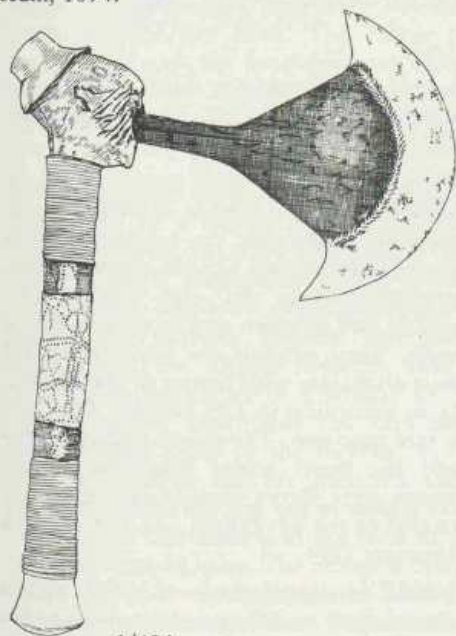

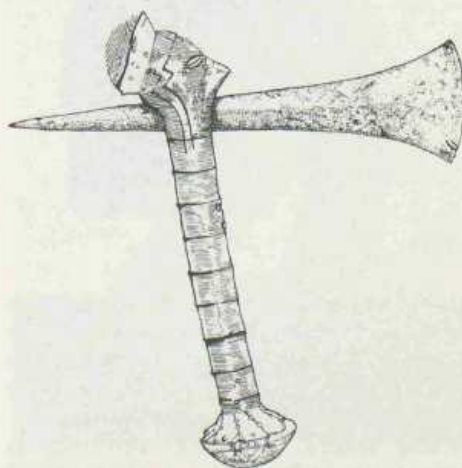
1/414 A hair pin with a carved head and pronounced Bayaka nose. The pin is damaged in places. H.: 22.7 cm. Zagreb Museum, 1894.

1/428—429 Swords from the Bayaka and used by their chiefs. The hilt is made of wood covered with skin and brass wire. The blade is triangular and has a groove running along the middle on each side. L.: 88.5 cm and 73 cm. Zagreb Museum, 1894. Almost identical but shorter (50 cm) is a sword belonging to the Loanda Museum (REDINHA, 1955, p. 72, photo 25).

1/436—437 Axes with sculptured shafts, in the form of a head with the blade protruding from the mouth. These axes are from the Bayaka, but decorated with brass sheeting made by the Bateke.

Weapons

Warlike Bayaka produced weapons like the fine swords used by their chiefs (1/428—9) or ceremonial axes (1/436—7).
