Points

In comparison with scrapers the number of points is small. The proportion of usable pointed pieces is still less. It may be that points as finished tools are not found at the factory site because they may have been taken away for use and dropped elsewhere.

All points are worked on flakes with mostly sub-triangular forms and some with slight bladish tendencies (fig. III/7 to 10; pl. 4, 5). Blades of oval shape are also common. In this case some flakes are really flake-blades. There is thus a mixture of flakes and flake-blades while true blade forms are absent. All of them are worked unifacially. Except for a few points whose front side carries a more or less substantial portion of the cortex, they generally have converging scar-beds on the front showing the removal of such flakes from the prepared cores.
