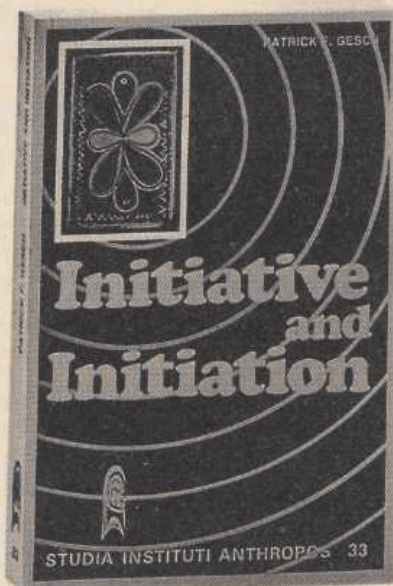

"This book takes its starting point with the Mt. Rurun Movement, a cargo cult-type popular religious movement centred at Yangoru in the East Sepik Province of Papua New Guinea, which has run from about 1969 to the present. The tradition is investigated to see how the village handles change and development, and to see how religious notions are looked for in nearly all aspects of life. Traditional initiation is chosen in the book as the most useful perspective for studying the tradition and change, and religion as permeating life."



Patrick F. Gesch was born in Townsville, Australia, in 1944. He joined the Divine Word Missionaries and was ordained a priest in 1970. He spent ten years working in the Negrie parish of Wewak Catholic Diocese, first as parish priest, and then doing research. This research resulted in a doctorate from the Religious Studies Department of the University of Sydney in 1982.
